

Minor scales

Before you try this worksheet, please review pp. 38-39 in our Theory Anthology. Page 4 is our reference for bass clef.

A. Natural minor

Construct the requested scale on the musical staff. All scales should be the "natural minor" version. Apply accidentals directly to the notes.








B. "Harmonic" minor scales

Create the requested scale on the staff. Apply accidentals directly to the notes. All scales should be in the "harmonic" minor variant, with a raised scale-degree $\hat{7}$. If your raised $\hat{7}$ has no sharp on it, you can mark it with a natural to indicate that it has been altered.

Example - C harmonic minor with a natural on the leading tone.
